

# DSM-IV-TR

## Antisocial Personality Disorder

- Pervasive pattern of disregard for and violation of the rights of others occurring since age 15

# DSM-IV-TR

## Antisocial Personal Disorder

- Failure to conform to social norms with respect to lawful behaviors- often arrested
- Deceitfulness –lying, aliases, conning for profit or pleasure
- Impulsivity or failure to plan ahead

# DSM-IV-TR

## Antisocial Personal Disorder

- Irritability and aggressiveness-repeated physical fights or assaults
- Reckless disregard for safety of self or others
- Consistent irresponsibility- work, money
- Lack of remorse-indifferent to or rationalizing having hurt, mistreated, or stolen form another

# DSM-IV-TR

## Conduct Disorder


- Aggression to people and animals
  - bullies, threatens, intimidate;
  - starts physical fights;
  - used weapon that can cause serious harm (bat, brick, broken bottle, knife, gun);
  - physically cruel to people/animals;
  - stolen while confronting a victim (mugging, purse snatching, extortion, armed robbery);
  - forced someone into sexual activity

# DSM-IV-TR

## Conduct Disorder

- Destruction of property-deliberately destroyed other's property including fire with intention a causing serious damage
- Deceitfulness or theft-broken into house, building, car;
  - Often lies to obtain goods or avoid obligations ("cons" others);
  - Stolen items of nontrivial value without confronting a victim (shoplifting)

# DSM-IV-TR



## Conduct Disorder

- Serious violations of rules
  - Often stays out at night against parents wishes (starting before 13)
  - Run away from home
  - Truant from school (before 13)


# DSM-IV-TR

## Oppositional Defiant Disorder

A pattern of negative, hostile and defiant behavior

Often...


- loses temper
- argues with adults
- defies or refuses to comply with adults' requests or rules
- deliberately annoys people
- blames others for mistakes or misbehaviors
- touch or easily annoyed by others
- angry and resentful
- spiteful or vindictive


